That set the stage for the second half of the game, which proved to be full of excitement for Mater Dei fans. The Wildcats battled to a 28-27 win over the Bulldogs.


The dance was held in the cafeteria after the game. Despite almost everyone's wet appearance, everyone had fun dancing to the theme of "Never Let You Go."


The fund-raising skits: A tradition of competition of performing in front of our peers and creating the impossible: **comedy!** Did they go too far this year? The judges seemed to think so.

## Football 'Necessary Roughness'

#### Cats overcome inexperience


Despite pre-season predictions, the Wildcats' determination led them to a 5-5 record, overcoming the odds of a young team.

The Wildcats opened their season by defeating the supposedly equal Central Bears, 30-0. They continued their winning streak by defeating their close rival, Memorial, 17-12. The Wildcats went on through the season determined to do their best. Some games they didn't come out ahead, but they were always fighting until the end.


Sophomore Adam Schiff proved his skill by completing 164 out of 284 passes for 1,917 yards and 13 touchdowns. Junior Brandon Boots caught 73 passes for 1,020 yards and 10 touchdowns. Schiff was the seventh leading passer in the state, while Boots was the state's fourth leading receiver.

Sophomore Nick Miller led the running game. He ran for 694 yards in 124 rushes. Leading the Wildcat defense was senior Mike Bishop with 82 tackles. He assisted on 69 others. Junior Rob Mallory was second with 54 tackles and 25 assists.

Overall, led by head coach Frank Will and assistant coach Mike Goebel, the Wildcats averaged 22.8 points per game. They also overwhelmed their opponents in total passing yards with 193.2 to 119.9 yards per game.



### Popular Mr. Will retires from coaching








The Cats captured their 22nd straight city title, and their 19th consecutive Sectional.


# Soccer 'Give up' not part of vocabulary

Under the bright lights of Coke Fields, the girls varsity soccer team showed its character early. After a


loss to State champion Memorial in the season opener, the team wasn't about to give up. In fact, it went on a five game winning streak.





Coach Brad Schultheis stated that






The girls were undefeated in the city and beat North by one stroke to win SIAC.


#### Senior doubles lead the way







United and motivated through their summer camp, the girls were determined to make this season one of the best ever. Not only did the squads unite, but many new friendships blossomed as the year progressed.



## Wrestlers win it all again


Against all odds. Despite all skepticism, the Wildcats proved everyone wrong. No one expected another state title with all of the injuries and lack of experience. But we did it ... again.

Starting it off with senior leadership, severely injured Mike Bishop and Tom Jankowski put forth a heroic effort to ignite Wildcat spirit. With coaches rejoicing, teammates congratulating, and fans cheering, the Matcats brought home their third straight state title. It came with a 32-18 victory over Penn.

Throughout the season, the Matcats were plagued by countless injuries and heartbreaking individual defeats. Tape and team spirit were the only things that held this team together.


The Wildcats brought home their share of tournament champions and team championships. They won the MD Holiday Classic for the 13th time, St. Louis Oakville, SIAC for the 22nd time, their 26th Sectional, their 19th Regional, their 12th Semi-state, and fourth state title (two dual, two individual). Representing MD at individual state were Curtis VanNess (103) 8th; Greg Schaefer (112) 2nd; Dan Jankowski (119); B.J. Hauke (125) 6th; Joe Mayer (135) 4th; Mike Schroeder (171) 4th. Schaefer's 47 victories and 38 pins were a Wildcat record.

Coach Mike Goebel's varsity record is 303-8-2, making him a member of the national "300 club." His teams have won 119 dual matches in a row. Coach Randy Helfrich's reserve record is now 291-0. Way to go Wildcats!











## **'Basketball Diaries'**

Cats go 12-9

PRIDE. It was the Mater Dei boys basketball team's motto for the 1996-97 season, and it was a feeling mirrored by the students and fans.

The Wildcats, led by seven seniors and head coach, Mr. Roger Sills, had a new approach for the season. With depth of at least two players at every position, the boys used 10 players almost every game and in some games, the maximum of 12 players.

The goal of the new partner system was to have five players giving their all for two- to three-minute intervals between substitutions. Using this strategy, the Cats were able to play more intensely the entire game. As a result, they outhustled a number of opponents.

Providing plenty of excitement for their fans, the Wildcats defeated Mount Vernon on Chris Maynard's last-second three-point basket early in the season. They also defeated Gibson Southern on Homecoming night before a packed gym.

They were noticed by several area coaches, including that of No. 15-ranked Bosse, whose coach said that Mater Dei blocked out better

than anybody he had seen this year.


The city's most surprising story kept getting better. The Wildcats' six-game winning streak was the longest in the city. Going 9-1 at home, the Wildcats had two SIAC victories in this season alone, compared to only two SIAC wins in the past six years. Mike Halbig led in both scoring and rebounding, averaging over 10 points and five rebounds a game. Four additional Wildcats averaged over seven points per game.


The varsity finished with a record of 12-9, which was the first winning season for the Wildcats since they finished 12-10 in 1981.

Coach Sills attributed much of the team's success to the seniors' leadership, the cheerleaders, Scream Team, pep band, and the unbelievable support of the student body and faculty.

The reserve team finished with a record of 12-6, and the freshmen went 17-3 as they captured the city title.

This remarkable season also marked the end of an era. It was the last year of one-class basketball in Indiana.

the pit to make it even more sloppy. With rain on the way, the tug-of-war was quickly finished and all other events were moved inside to the main gym. But the rain didn't melt the


students' enthusiasm.

But the juniors and seniors were tied for first. A tie breaker event was decided on. Three boys and three girls from both classes were chosen to pair up for a wheelbarrow race.







#### The Walk of the 600 Wildcats




# Band Mr. Mace's Thanks to a lot of hard work by band boosters, Mr.









The team qualified a record number of competitors for State, including sophomore Emily Elpers;









#### 'Reality Bites,' but yearbook makes it look spectacular


The title caught your attention, didn't it? The song and movie titles are just a few of the things the yearbook crew did new this year.





#### Cats make run at Sectional



But in the semifinals against North Posey, a close game after five innings turned into an 8-2 Viking victory. And the Cats ended their season with a 10-16 record.




On a brighter note, the reserve baseball team finished with a 13-7 record.



Many hours were spent on perfecting minor details because after all, it's the "little things that count," as Coach Rupert put it.


It was the little things that led the Wildcats to their second straight Sectional title.

Michelle, a senior centerfield, led the City in stolen bases, and, along with Jonelle, made the All-District team. Jonelle was the Cats' outstanding shortstop.





Three runners qualify for State










The boys golf team had a middle-of-the-road kind of season. The Cats finished fifth in the 8-team city tournament and ninth in the 13-team Sectional.





# Girls are best in MD history






