

THE LITERACY PROBLEM

- 43% of adults are functionally illiterate.*
- 33% of 8th graders read at or below grade level.*
- Minorities and low socioeconomic students have significant gaps.




- Increase in high school dropouts.


CLASS INFORMATION





Circle the prefix/root and fill in the blanks with the correct prefix or root. Bonus points.


Reflection

RESULTS


- 95% of students did well circling the root and prefixes
- 72% of students improved their grades after bonus points (writing words with the given root)

MOST COMMON MISTAKES




RESULTS WITHOUT BONUS POINTS 15
